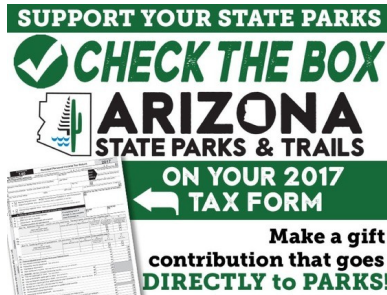
Support your Arizona State Parks and Trails this Tax Season! Michelle Thompson

Did you know that you can use your state tax refund to help maintain, operate and improve your Arizona State Parks? By checking the box for the Sustainable State Parks and Roads fund on your Arizona tax return, you can designate some, all, or more than your refund to assist state parks! Arizona State Parks and Trails receives no state general fund money and is a self-sustaining system. The entrance fees

collected are what mainly support the staffing, maintenance and improvements for your parks and trails. Every year, Arizonans have the opportunity to use tax season to give back to the causes that mean the most to them. Your voluntary gift can make a difference to the Arizona state parks you enjoy all year round. Your donation helps Arizona State Parks & Trails operate, maintain and make capital improvements to buildings, roads, parking lots, highway entrances and any related structure used to operate the parks.

YAVAPAI COUNTY PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT OVERLAY ROAD WORK Dan Cherry, Director

Yavapai County will be performing an asphalt overlay project on **Shrine Drive in Yarnell**, Rimrock Road in Paulden, Esperanza Road in Chino Valley, and Old Black Canyon Highway in Prescott. Construction work will include overlaying the existing roads with new asphalt and new guardrail work on Old Black Canyon Highway. Construction will begin March 5, 2018, and continue through April 12, 2018. One lane of traffic will remain open at all times; however, motorists may encounter lane restrictions, reduced speeds, and flagging operations throughout the work zone. Motorists should expect minor delays and allow extra time to get through the construction area. Please follow all traffic control devices when traveling through the work zone.
